

#### From Rev. Kim Plumpton

Dear friends,

My recent engagement with Mission Council has left me feeling excited about the air of change that is beginning to take shape in the URC.

Some items on the agenda were:

The nature of call in the URC: We are entering into a new era which needs a new way of calling ministers because things have changed. There are real issues when there is need to accommodate multi-church pastorates. The way we call ministers at the present time will not accommodate ministry in the future. We are also being challenged to consider what the future looks like not just with stipendiary ministers but with a mixed economy including non-stipendiary and lay people as well.

A commitment to Gods creation, we should do our best to look through an environmental lens, looking at becoming ecochurches, emphasising that little steps can make a big *Continued next page*  difference, even being encouraged to go vegetarian for a day a week. We should raise awareness of the issue of climate change in our churches. Making sure we pray for those people and places affected by climate change.

- The commitment to Greenbelt last year was well received and the URC tent came alive with interesting conversations and craft events. We are encouraged to consider joining them from 25th to 28th August at Boughton House, Kettering.
- Where is God calling the URC? This was presented by the thirteen Synod Moderators which in itself was a powerful statement. There needs to be a change in our habits, the healthiest churches are about being effective, they will not allow themselves to bound by clutter. The moderators cited the closet rule, don't bring one new thing in unless you let one go too. An attachment to the past or a fear of the future stops us from decluttering. We are encouraged to gather stories in our locality where 'letting go' of some things have been helpful. So we ask ourselves the questions: What is this for? How is this extending God's kingdom? What are we here for?
- Of course there are sad moments too. The most sensitive conversation was wrapped around the Windermere centre. The committee at the last MC were given three options to look at: to go into partnership in the Christian hospitality business, carry on or close the centre.
- Conversations with the Christian hospitality business were not successful, the centre is leaking money, so after extensive consultations the committee suggested that the Windermere centre be closed. It was noted that much of what can be done there can be done elsewhere and fewer people consider doing residential retreats and look for more local training. There was no viable proposal to keep the centre open. The decision was made to close the centre.

When I came away from the three day meeting I felt encouraged that together much had been explored, much had been engaged with and with the shared wisdom in the room much had been discerned. There is change in the air and that is as it should be, God may well be unchanging but his people are always called to be on the move.

Please do not attempt to contact Lynda directly. At the end of this period Occupational Health will review the situation and advise the next stage of the journey.
- 2. Lynda is deeply appreciative of the care and concern expressed over the past months and values your continued prayers and support in her journey back to full health. As you continue to express that care and support can we ask that you give Lynda the private space that she needs to continue the journey.
- 3. Lynda begins her phased return as from Tuesday 13th June.

#### You don't have to live in Effingham to come and join us



Most counties in England have an annual 'Ride & Stride', on the second Saturday in September, to raise money for church restoration and repair. Cyclists (and walkers) are given a list of participating churches in their area, but map out their own route by bike or on foot, and then get friends to sponsor them for a fixed amount per church visited. The money collected is divided into two, with half going to the church of the cyclists choice; the other half is retained by the Surrey Churches Preservation Trust for distribution to churches in need who apply for a grant. In the dozen or so years that the Bike Ride has been running, Surrey has raised over £250,000.

This year's event is on **Saturday 9<sup>th</sup> September.**

#### The Joint Public Issues Team

Since 2007, the Joint Public Issues Team (JPIT) has combined the expertise of the Baptist Union, the Methodist Church and the United Reformed Church, and the Church of Scotland in the area of public issues. The Team aims to enable the four Churches to work together in living out the gospel of Christ in the Church and in wider society. To challenge racism and discrimination and to promote equality and justice by influencing those in power and by energising and supporting local congregations.





**The New Room** in Bristol is the oldest Methodist Chapel in the world (1739) and the cradle of the early Methodist movement. It was built and used by John Wesley and the early Methodists as a meeting and preaching place and centre for helping and educating needy members of the community. Famously, the chapel has a statue of John on his horse in the courtyard, with a museum telling the story of John and Charles Wesley and their life and work in Bristol. Over 25,000 visitors come every year from all over the world to see it!

Now, at the entrance from Horsefair, Charles Wesley's statue greets visitors to a new courtyard, transformed by The "Horsefair Project"; a major refit costing about £4 million, which has created an amazing museum, library, conference facilities and a café/visitor centre and bookshop. Funded by donations and the Heritage Lottery fund, Bristol Methodist District, and filming some of BBC's Poldark !

Dave and I were invited, by Methodist Heritage, to attend the Chapel's Rededication Service, which was so uplifting, with fantastic singing, as you would expect from Methodists. **The President and vice President of Conference** led the prayers to thank God for all those who had made the project possible, and other local folk gave us a flavour of the past, present and future work of the New Room. After the service, Gary Best, the present Warden gave us a guided tour of the museum, which is fascinating. If you get the chance, do go to Bristol and see it for yourself. It will relight your fire for Methodism and inspire you to meet the needs of your community, just as John and Charles did all those years ago, when they bought a plot of land and built a meeting room for those responding to the Gospel.




