

The Minister Writes



Dear Friends,

September marks the beginning of the new Methodist year, and this September is a new start for our three churches in various ways.

Most importantly, we welcome Kim Plumpton to be minister of Cobham and Effingham churches, in partnership with Cobham URC. We are very much looking forward to her ordination and induction at Cobham URC on 25th September. For us Methodists it will be unusual to be part of an ordination at one of our local churches, and I hope that people across all three churches will come and support Kim, and affirm our new partnership with the URC in this area.

Before that, on Sunday 19th September, I will be inducted as the minister of Christ Church URC, Leatherhead. Again, I hope it will be a service that is supported by all the churches. It seems somewhat strange to be having a welcome service in Leatherhead after being here thirteen years, but it signals a new phase in ministry, not just for me, but for Christ Church and LMC, as we seek to more actively develop a common mission strategy, making the best use of our common resources, remembering too our commitments under the Covenant, to work in partnership with our Anglican friends in Leatherhead as well.

As part of developing that mission strategy, at LMC we are going to use the morning of Saturday September 25th, as a time of strategic planning, addressing the question: 'LMC in five years time?' seeking to work through the particular gifts and graces which God has given us, and how we develop them over the coming years.

I will be leading a similar session for Christ Church at the end of October, and the outcomes of those meetings will be our guide for how we go on from there.

At the same time, this Autumn sees important developments in our joint children, family and youth work in Leatherhead. To develop the fantastic work done at Holiday Club, (with over 90 children attending this year), Triumph AM, for children 9 and above, will now meet for fun, teaching and worship, on the second and fourth Sundays of each month at 10.30. While the younger children and their families are invited to Messy Church, a new initiative, with messy craft, worship and a shared meal, based round a bible story, which will meet on the third Thursday of the month at 4.00 p.m. at LMC.

Other plans for LMC in the autumn are to brighten up the outside front of the church, with a new notice-board, and clearing some of the overgrown bushes, to make the church building look as welcoming as we hope the church community is. When things are ready we will be looking for a working party to help with this.

It is a time with a lot going on, with much to think and pray about. Some may find this exciting, others unsettling, but I hope that we can be open about our thoughts and views, and also that through it all, we can grow deeper in our praver life, as we seek God's guidance, and know his loving support.



## What is a Quiet Day?

"Quiet Day" is a term commonly used for a day set apart to listen to God. My own description is "Me Time", a precious space to withdraw from the hustle and bustle of the everyday goings-on and to think deeply about what the title of the day suggests and how, as individuals, we latch on to any Bible references.

There is no right or wrong way to approach a Quiet Day. Each person is so very different in their needs and the way they go about things. The leader will only make suggestions to lead into a theme. There will be no organised group discussion nor any feed-back sessions. There is rarely utter silence - that can feel very threatening - but a peaceful serenity, with an unspoken support between everyone there.

I have been to many Quiet Days, each one different from any other. I remember on one occasion, after the introductions, a lady found a comfy spot and slept the day away, even missing lunch. She declared it 'the best day ever'!

But we all need this time apart. If we commit ourselves to spend time listening to God, we are more likely to hear God's word to us. By hearing God, we are strengthened and healed, and we can be agents of God's justice in the day-to-day life of which we are a part. I once read that attending a Quiet Day is like putting an 'At Home' sign on the window of our soul so God can see we are ready to listen.

Our Quiet Day on Saturday 9th October challenges us to 'catch God's vision' for ourselves and the wider world. Are you up to such a challenge?

Wednesday began hopefully with a number of people coming in, but they were lost souls wanting the physical health check offered by the company booked into the halls at the back. As they hurried through, in one door and out the other, they didn't recognise the spiritual "health check" we offered.

For a short time on Thursday morning, Jigsaw was alive with children and adults from Spatterbox. Some mums were worried that the children would run around, make a noise, touch things. Freda and I, stewarding at the time, said in unison "So what!" We encouraged the children to examine the dolls, swirl the globe and smell the lemon-scented geranium. "Whose Birthday is it?" the children asked when they saw the balloons. The wind chimes were rung so vigorously, it was like the great wind of the first Pentecost! We had blown out the candles so there was no risk of "tongues of flame" to test the fire alarm! It was 20 minutes of such joy! David's quiet background music should have been changed to the Hallelujah Chorus!

On Saturday, a couple came for a second time to "experience the peace" and to write down words that attracted them. They were given the jigsaw piece written in Jill's beautiful calligraphy. "I'm going to frame it" the man said.
